Here's the latest update on contract negotiations

Your LWEA Bargaining Team has been hard at work getting ready to represent you in contract negotiations with the district. We just concluded 65 bargaining input meetings and are now going over all the data that was collected.

Last Friday, the team launched an all-member bargaining survey to gather information on your interests and priorities. Be sure you complete the survey before the deadline of 9am on Tuesday, January 17. Here's a link to the survey if you missed it: https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/LWEA2017Bargain.

On February 1-3, our team and the district's team will be jointly trained on interest-based contract negotiations and will begin bargaining. Interest-based bargaining is a process in which teams identify issues and work together to find common interests and common solutions in a problem-solving, collaborative manner.

From February through early May, the teams will be working together in joint subcommittees to propose draft contract agreements. In mid-May, both teams will be sequestered for five days to attempt to come up with a final agreement that will be brought before LWEA members for a vote. Is your certificate expiring?

Did you know that maintaining your certification is your responsibility? That also means that you are also responsible for the renewal of your teaching certificate.

OSPI has set up a new online procedure where educators can manage their certifications and endorsements. The OSPI e-Certification service enables educators to:

- Apply for credentials online
- Monitor application status
- Receive expiration and renewal reminders
- Print certificates
- Update contact information

OSPI provides online training and information about the e-Certification service. Educators can access these at this <u>link</u>. Anyone renewing their certificates are to maintain required certification/endorsements completely online.

Certificated staff with an expiration date of June 30, 2017 on their certificate must start the renewal process ASAP to guarantee maintenance of a valid certification before the certificate expires. Do not wait until the last minute as you might not be able to complete the requirements prior to the expiration date. YOU MAY BE REMOVED FROM THE CLASSROOM WITHOUT PAY IF YOUR CERTIFICATE EXPIRES.

Note: National Board Certified teachers (NBCT) are still required to renew their certificates prior to the expiration date. Being a NBCT does not change your responsibility for renewing your certification.

LWEA benefit pool change

Based on current enrollment, medical usage, and state contributions, the district has calculated that the benefits pool will decrease by \$19 per person per month. This change will take effect with the January 31, 2017 payroll.

What bargaining can do...

THEN: Anonymous complaints could be used in disciplinary action and could affect your employment.

NOW: Complaints are to be called to the attention of the employee ASAP. If that doesn't take place, complaints may not be used as a basis for discipline or evaluation.
